



### BERMUDA CELEBRATED THE THRILLING RETURN OF THE BERMUDA INTERNATIONAL 7S TOURNAMENT

Hamilton, Bermuda – In its 7th year, the much-anticipated Bermuda International 7s Tournament electrified the National Sports Centre in Bermuda on March 15 & 16, showcasing an impressive roster of rugby talent from both college and high school teams across the US, along with a special exhibition from Bermuda's very own rising stars.

The annual tournament made its return this weekend, drawing rugby enthusiasts to witness the high-octane action over two exhilarating days. The event featured a College Division, including teams such as the Bermuda Rugby All Stars, Dartmouth I, Dartmouth II, Iona University, Iowa State I, Iowa State II, Norwich University, Rowan University, Saratoga U23, and UHSP. The High School Division spotlighted the Bermuda All Stars, Beyond Rugby, and Bondurant Blue Plague (HSB), promising a display of budding talent and future rugby stars.

Bermuda's collegiate team was led by player-coach Hadleigh Tucker, supported by BRFU Director of 7s Jonathan Cassidy, while U23s Coach Christopher Naylor headed up Bermuda's high school teams. An added highlight of this year's tournament was an exhibition game featuring Bermuda's promising U12 and U14 talent, headed up by coaches Rob Steinhoff and Conor McGlynn, as they prepared for their upcoming international tour, offering a glimpse into the future of Bermuda rugby.

Stephen Siano, President of Seven Sports & Rugby, expressed his excitement about the tournament, stating, "The Bermuda International 7s has always been a showcase of exceptional rugby talent, and this year was no exception. We were thrilled to welcome back teams and spectators to what proved to be a spectacular display of skill, sportsmanship, and competition."

This year, American collegiate coaches not only closely monitored their own squads in the competition but also cast their gaze toward the talented young athletes from the Beyond Rugby

programme who aspired to play at the college level. These coaches recognized the potential for discovering emerging talent that could benefit their teams, leading to the prospect of offering scholarship opportunities to standout players.

Previous scholarship recipients included Nathaniel Morgan, Keonte White, and Alex Doyling.

Gemma Godfrey, President of the Bermuda Rugby Football Union, shared her enthusiasm, saying, "Hosting this annual competition was a great honor. The Bermuda International 7s is not just a tournament; it's a celebration of rugby's spirit and the close-knit community it fosters. We were excited to show our guests the warm hospitality Bermuda is known for and watch our young talent shine on the international stage."

The event was proudly partnered with the Royal Bermuda Regiment, Goslings, Southampton Rangers, and Rugby. These partnerships underscored the community's support for the event and its contribution to promoting rugby in Bermuda.

### **New to Pickleball? Intro and Beginners Coaching Sessions** at WER Joell continue



### **Bermuda Equestrian Federation**







It is with deep sadness that the Bermuda Equestrian Federation shares of the passing of Michael Cherry - former President of the Bermuda Equestrian Federation.

Born to Horace and Winifred Cherry on 3rd of September 1937, Mr. Cherry grew upon in Northamptonshire upon a farm used for growing

crops and raising cattle. As the farm had five plough horses, Mr. Cherry (affectionately known as Papa Cherry or Mr. C.) was introduced to horses at an early age. Although he never took up equestrian sport, little did he know that his farm experience would stand in good stead for his commitment to the Bermuda Equestrian Federation and its members.

After having served in the Royal Air Force as well as the Leicester City Police Force, Mr. Cherry arrived in Bermuda on 6th July 1959, to join the Bermuda Police Force. He remained on the force through to 1968 when he switched careers and became the co-owner of Watlington and Conyers.

Mr. Cherry met and married the love of his life, Anne. The couple married on 1st September 1961. They were blessed with daughter Lesley, son Dennis and four granddaughters and two grandsons. Both Dennis and Lesley are themselves accomplished athletes. Lesley represented Bermuda in swimming regional competitions whilst Dennis became an accomplished equestrian representing Bermuda in three-day Eventing as well as rugby; the latter of which Mr. Cherry thoroughly enjoyed together with sailing and squash.

One could say that it was Mr. Cherry's interest and support in his children's sports that led to him embracing various sporting roles, including technical and public relations for swimming and equestrian events. In addition, Mr. Cherry. held various positions with the Bermuda Olympic Association and was President of the Bermuda Equestrian Federation for 20 years; positions he held with great commitment and unwavering dedication.

Mr. Cherry was Bermuda's representative for the Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI). The FEI establishes the regulations and approves equestrian programs at Championship, Continental, Regional Games as well as the Olympic and Para Olympic Games. During his tenure as BEF President, Mr. Cherry represented Bermuda at 15 FEI General Assemblies. At the 2015 General Assembly, FEI President Ingmar de Vos presented Mr. Cherry with the FEI Badge of Honour for his dedicated service.

Mr. Cherry, together with wife Anne, have been the backbones of the BEF - managing administrative and governance duties as well as assisting with preparation before, during and after BEF events. The "Cherry Team" were often the first to arrive and the last to leave horseshows. Mr. Cherry was dedicated to promoting Bermuda's equestrians.

The Bermuda Equestrian Federation extend its deepest condolences to Mr. Cherry's family as well as Bermuda's equestrian community.

### **Bermuda Equestrians Compete in the Grand Caraibe Tour Held in Martinique**

Bermuda equestrians Tyler James, Kayla Bardgett and Kimoy Cruickshank recently competed in the Grand Caribe Tour held in Martinique on 17th and 18th February.

The Grand Caribe Tour is a prestigious internationally renounced show jumping event highlighting exceptional equestrian talent amongst the southern Caribbean nations of Suriname, French Guyana, Martinique, and Guadeloupe. Recognizing the potential to offer a platform to foster inter Caribbean exchanges, the competition has included other nationals within the region.

Indeed, more than 100 athletes from eight countries including Antigua and Barbuda, the Bahamas, Bermuda, French Guyana, Guadeloupe, Jamaica, Martinique, and Suriname competed in three jumping levels on Martinique based horses dedicated especially to the competition.

The Bermuda team, as well as the Bahamas Team, rode under the guidance and coaching of Bermuda Grand Prix rider Raishun Burch and FEI Official and CEA President, Heidi Shelley Mello.

The fourth and final leg of the 2023/24 Grand Caraibe Tour will be held in Guadeloupe from 8th - 12th May 2024. The Bermuda competitors described it as a wonderful experience that provided an opportunity to test their skills and to meet equestrians from various competing countries.

DHPC Harness Racing Season closes with a golden Victory for "Special Gold"

Driven by veteran driver Kiwon Waldron and owned by Lee and Sergio Raynor, Special Gold closed out the 2023/24 DHPC Racing Season by winning the coveted Champion of Champions. This fearless team secured top placings in three of four races to claim the fastest combined average in the four-race series held at the National Equestrian Center over the 9th and 10th March weekend. In second place was Double Time owned and driven by Candyce Martins.

- Most Improved Adult: Panzy Olander, who made a significant leap from the back of the pack to challenging the podium in road racing and mountain biking, demonstrating immense growth and determination.
- Club Person of the Year: Greg Hopkins, for his exceptional contributions in 2023. Greg's dedication as race director, volunteer, promoter of the BBA, and enthusiastic supporter of cyclists has been instrumental in advancing cycling in Bermuda.
- Race Official of the Year: Debbie Titterton Narraway, recognized for her dedication as a volunteer race official, ensuring the safety and fairness of cycling competitions in Bermuda.
- Race Organiser: Bermuda Rouleurs Cycling Club [BRCC], whose innovative course design and collaboration led to one of the favorite courses like the Ronde van Sint George criterium cycling race including the cobbles of Water Street.
- Junior Cyclist of the Year: Annabelle Miller, showcased her talent by clinching the Bermuda National Junior Road and Time Trial Championship titles. Her remarkable performance at the Commonwealth Youth Games Road race in Trinidad displayed incredible determination as she overcame a mechanical setback to skillfully maneuver through the competition, narrowly missing a podium finish.
- Female Cyclist of the Year: Caitlin Conyers, raced to victory earning both the Bermuda National Time Trial and Road Race Championship titles. The highlight of her year was the bronze medal at the CAC Games, a testament to her exceptional talent and dedication.
- Male Cyclist of the Year: Conor White, excelled in cycling with victories at the Bermuda National Criterium Championship, a gold medal at the Caribbean individual time trial, and bronze medals at the Central American and Caribbean Games in El Salvador and the Pan Am Games in Chile. His bronze at the Pan Am Games marked Bermuda's first medal at the event since 2015, adding to Conor's impressive accomplishments and elevating Bermuda's profile in international cycling competitions.

### **Mountain Bike Season**

Robin Horsfield successfully defended his Winners Edge Mountain Bike Cross Country National Championships Men's Open title at Southlands.

Horsfield led from start to finish clocking a time of 58:46.477, Chequan Richardson was second in 1:12:34.518, and Alex Pilgrim finished third stopping the clock in 1:13.58.282.

Panzy Olander clocked a winning time of 49:15.238 in the Women's Open Division, Caitlin Convers was second in 59:07.140, and Wendy-Ann Thomas finished third clocking 1:00:33.840.

### **RULES & 2024 SEASON GUIDE**

**NEW RULE** – bikes will be checked at each race, 1H1(d) - relates to the permitted degree of inward angle of the shifter levers to be in compliance with the UCI's rule change. Competitors in road events should expect race officials to check this at each event. For those at home wishing to get a rough idea of whether their levers are afoul of the new rule, they can use the Compass app on their smartphones.

### Reminder of Rider Responsibilities (no matter their age).

As a participant in BBA races, riders have certain responsibilities to ensure the smooth running of events, including:

- Must be a paid-up member of the BBA
- Be on time to collect timing chip no later than 15 minutes before published start time and be ready to start when called to the line
- Listen to and follow all instructions provided during the race briefing
- Reminder all BBA members are subject to Anti-Doping Rule and testing
- Read and understand the BBA Rules
