The FEI Challenge offers an Individual classification (per country, per geographical zone and per height category). It also offers Team Classification, per geographical zone

The Overall Country Results will be determined once all participating countries have competed in the three competitions that make up the Challenge. Countries have until 31st December 2024 to do so. Judging the third competition was FEI Level 2 Judge John Flisk together with Bermuda FEI Level 1 Judge Pamela Mahoney. Designing this year's jumping course was FEI Level 3 Course Designer Kate Launder of South Africa.

Pan American Championships

Nicholas Narraway produced one of the rides of his life to win a silver medal at the Pan American Road Cycling Championships in Brazil.

Competing in the under-23 time trial over three 11 kilometers laps in Sao Jose dos Campos, Narraway crossed the line in 45min 35.581sec to make it onto the podium and was just nine seconds off the gold medal, which was claimed by Hector Quintana, of Chile.

Kaden Hopkins was denied a place on the podium in a sprint finish to the road race at the Pan American Road Cycling Championships on Sunday.

In rainy conditions, Hopkins was awarded the same time as winner Leangel Meneses (4hr 17min 49.69 sec) of Venezuela as he crossed the line in sixth position. Bermuda's other rider, Conor White, finished 20th.

It was the second time at these championships, which have taken place in Brazil this week, that Hopkins has just missed out on a medal after he finished fourth, a place in front of White, in the time trial on Thursday.

National Archery Association of Bermuda

The National Archery Association of Bermuda's Men Recurve Team competed in two archery competitions in Medellin, Colombia from 7-14 April 2024.

The first event was the World Archery Paris Olympic Games Continental Qualifier for the Americas.

Archers Camerin Pickering, Bernard Wade III and Jaydon Roberts competed in the Individual Men's Recurve Division for an Olympic Spot for the games. Each athlete performed well against a total lineup of 37 archers. Bermuda needed to finish in the top two to secure a spot for the Olympic Games. Camerin Pickering was seeded 11th in Qualifications and ranked 5th in the eliminations round, he also set a new Bermuda National Record of 646/720 at 70m. Bernard Wade and Jaydon Roberts were seeded 20th and 22nd in Qualifications and their final ranking was 17th.

The trio then competed in the World Archery 2024 Pan American Championship which was a Team Event Qualifier for the Olympic Games. From the qualifier of 58 archers, Camerin Pickering was seeded 28th, Jaydon Roberts 43rd and Bernard Wade 45th. In the eliminations, Camerin was ranked 17th and Jaydon and Bernard were ranked 33rd.

Bermuda was one of the thirteen teams in the eliminations event and finished in 10th place.

"Overall, Team Bermuda's performance was good and at each event, they continue to improve in the sport and increase their ranking. The Americas region has recognized Bermuda's development in the sport of archery and sees us as contenders in this sport. While we have not secured an individual or team spot for the 2024 Paris Olympics at these events, we have another opportunity in Antalya, Turkey at the second qualifiers in June 2024. To continue their preparations, our junior archer, Jaydon Roberts, will be traveling to El Salvador in May for the Pan American Youth Games Qualifier. The two senior archers are preparing themselves for a USA Archery Regional event in Gainesville, Florida in May," advised Assistant Coach/Team Manager Trina Roberts.

World Archery Americas held its General Assembly on 10 April 2024. Trina Roberts was voted onto the Development Committee to serve a four-year term. This committee supports the development of archery in the Americas with recommendations for specific rules, and procedures, organizing training as well as coaching support for athletes, coaches and judges for the region and the world.

MAY

Jaydon Roberts, Recurve Junior Male, traveled to San Salvador in El Salvador to compete in the Pan American Youth & Masters Championships which commenced on the 7 May 2024. In qualifications, he finished 12th out of 22 archers at 70 m. In the elimination rounds, he finished in 9th place. Jaydon then went on to compete in the Junior Pan Am Games qualifier where he finished in 6th place and earned Bermuda a spot to compete in the Junior Pan American Games that will be held in Asuncion, Paraguay in 2025.

Jaydon was pleased with his results and his ability to have earned a qualification spot for Bermuda. He has also used this tournament to prepare him for the last Paris Olympic qualifier. This event will be held in Antalya, Turkey for an individual spot from the 12th – 17th June 2024. He will also be traveling with Camerin Pickering and Bernard Wade III who make up the National Recurve Men's team and they will be competing for a team spot during the Hyundai Archery World Cup Stage 3 from the 18th – 23rd of June. Also accompanying the team for the Hyundai Archery World Cup shoot is Robin Selley, Recurve Junior Female Archer.

Coach Ross Roberts was traveling with Jaydon and said, "These juniors all shot well and there were 20 countries represented at this event. Our goal was for Jaydon to obtain a qualification spot for the games in 2025 which was attained. The next qualifier will be held in March 2025 where Jaydon Roberts will return along with teammates Robin Selley and Elektra Smith to secure an individual female spot and a mixed-team spot.

Recurve Junior Female Archer, N'Dera Smith may be separated from her teammates temporarily however, she recently shot a personal best in an Indoor Competition in Pennsylvania. N'Dera who is attending Westmoreland County Community College in Pennsylvania, took part in the State Championship JOAD Indoor Championship - East and West. N'Dera won the under-21 women's recurve title with a personal best of 445/600 at 18m. She mentioned, "I have set weekly training and have managed to find a balance between school and archery. I am pleased with my competition and grateful for the continued support from my Bermuda Coaches Ross Roberts and Trina Roberts for their continued support. Coach Trina said, "N'Dera has a club in Pennsylvania where she shoots weekly as part of the USA JOAD program. This is an excellent program which is the same program we use to develop our archers locally. Coach Ross and I check in with her periodically and with the use of technology, we can observe her in real-time and provide coaching/feedback. She is doing very well, and we have started discussions to increase her distance to ready her for the outdoor season."

Our association extends our thanks to the Department of Sport & Recreation for the two Elite Athlete financial grants provided to Camerin Pickering, Jaydon Roberts and the NJASP grant provided to Robin Selley which will support these athletes with their future events.
